- account for (v.) /ə'kaont fɔ:r/: To explain the reason for something
 Example: The researchers had to account for the environmental factors that could affect their results.
- 2. accumulate (v.) /əˈkjuːmjəleɪt/: To collect or increase something gradually, especially over a period of time

Example: Carbon dioxide <u>accumulates</u> in the atmosphere and contributes to global warming.

- carry out (v.) /'kæri aut/: To do or complete something
 Example: The government is <u>carrying out</u> a survey to assess the impact of logging on the forest ecosystem.
- considerably (adv.) /kənˈsɪdərəbli/: To a large or noticeable degree
 Example: The forest area has decreased <u>considerably</u> in the past decade due to deforestation.

5. deposit (n.) /dr'ppzɪt/: A layer or mass of a substance that has been left somewhere, especially by a natural process

Example: The soil samples showed high levels of metal <u>deposits</u> from the nearby mining site.

6. eventually (adv.) /1'ven.tʃu.ə.li/: In the end; finally

Example: **Eventually**, the forest fire was put out by the rain.

7. expend (v.) /ik'spend/: To use or spend time, effort, or money

Example: The government should <u>expend</u> more resources on environmental health research.

8. foliage (n.): /'fəʊ.li.ɪdʒ/: The leaves of a plant or of many plants Example: Some insects feed on the *foliage* of certain trees.

9. maintenance (n.): /'mem.tə.nəns/: The work needed to keep a road, building, machine, etc. in good condition

Example: Regular <u>maintenance</u> is essential for the health and safety of the equipment.

10. make up (v.) / merk Ap/: To form something

Example: What percentage of the atmosphere does oxygen <u>make up</u>?

11. mass (n.) /mæs/: A large amount of something that has no particular shape or arrangement

Example: A mass of plastic waste was found floating in the ocean.

12. ratio (n.) /'rei.ʃi.əu/: The relationship between two groups or amounts that expresses how much bigger one is than the other

Example: The *ratio* of carbon dioxide to oxygen in the air is increasing due to human activities.
